
Guidelines for Canoeing

- Elim is marked on the right of the map.
- Apart from a channel most of the water for about 1000 metres from shore is much less than 2 metres in depth depending on the tide. (Highest tides are around Easter, end of June, September and just before Christmas)
- There is a channel about 300 metres off shore that is over 2 metres deep.
- Life Jackets must be worn in case of a change in the weather.
- Off shore breezes and winds can blow you a long way quickly.
- If you can't paddle back you may be able to walk to the shore closest to you and drag the canoe back.
- Canoes are always easier to use with little water in them.
- The BRIGHT BLUE Sailing Club building is a good landmark. If you can't see it you are too far away.
- Stay with your canoe if you are in trouble as they are easy to find because of their colour.
- The closest point across the lake is 4.5 km away & the furthest point is 7.5kms.
- A rescue boat is available subject to tidal conditions.
